Our graduates are working for companies including Habitat, Hallmark Cards, Sandersons, Edinburgh Weavers, Edmund Bell, Surface Print Fine Wallpapers as freelance artists for Alexander McQueen fashion, as teachers within schools and colleges or as self-employed makers exhibiting at galleries and events.

The course covers designing and making processes for interior fabrics, wallpapers and accessories, fashion, giftware, stationery and ceramics designing for future trends three years ahead of season, and for applied arts and contemporary craft products supported by professional practice and self promotion. We have a wide range of links with industry for live project briefs, and offer opportunities with galleries and arts organisations including the Great Northern Contemporary Craft Fair and Manchester Craft and Design Centre.
